ELVIRA RIOS

Mexico City, 11/16/1913 - 1/13/1987. Elvira Gallegos Cerda, with a deep voice and almost speaking the song, was the first Mexican bolero to make an impact in the Southern Cone. In Mexico, she was an important artist on the XEW station, she later decided to live for a time in Paris, and more than 10 years in the United States, where she was an exclusive artist for NBC. When she returned, she sang again for XEW, but they had to take the microphones to her house, and from there she sang. She was nicknamed "La emocional" (the emotional), and also "La voz de humo", a translation of what North Americans call a "smoky voice", which she really had. She returned to New York, performing in the Rainbow Room at Rockefeller Center. She was in Cuba. In 1979, she gave her final performances. She stayed long periods in Buenos Aires, recording there as well. She made some movies in Mexico. Rico, work cited, p. 440.

NIÑO RIVERA

Pinar del Río, 4/18/1919 - 1/27/1996. Andrés Perfecto Eleuterio Galdino Confessor Echevarría Callava. Tresero, composer and arranger. Born into a musical family, his uncle was a tresero and director of the Sexteto Caridad, where he debuted "El Niño" at the age of five as a bongo player. His family moved to Havana in 1926 and joined El Segundo Boloña as tresero and also alternated in the Cárdenas Sexteto. He returned to Pinar del Río in 1929 and reorganized the Sexteto Caridad. In 1935 he achieves some performances in Havana. In 1937 he joined the Bolero septet, of which he later became director. In 1942 he founded and directed the Septeto Rey de Reyes, which had the innovation of a quartet of harmonic voices within the son style. At this point, El Niño had completed his musical studies and began as an arranger, at the same time he connected with the feeling and it is thanks to his orchestrations for the Conjunto Casino and other groups that the feeling of

José Antonio Méndez and other composers accesses recordings for the first time. It is also the time when he began as a composer, he wrote his best-known number El jamaiquino, already a standard of Cuban music. And others like Atomo, Fiesta en el Cielo. He becomes an arranger for many record labels and orchestras. He travels to Mexico in 1956 where he also arranges for various orchestras there. After '60 he founded and directed his group El Niño Rivera and his Conjband. He travels to Italy and other countries.

His albums include "El Niño Rivera y su conjband", "Praga", "Cuba te salutes", "Canciones inolividables" and he was also the arranger of the recordings made in 1981 by the Estrellas de Areito group. He is not the father of Paquito D'Rivera, who had the same name. The notes of the Mayfair album that we detail later, say: "for 25 years he has been perhaps the leading exponent of Cuban conga frumming. Born in Havana, Tito has toured the world with Xavier Cugat, being congero (sic) for Peggy Lee, and worked the famous Cocaanut Grove with Yma Sumac. Moreover, he is a prolific composer of Cuban songs and the first to introduce or Hollywood authentic ensemble music." He adds that the orchestra is made up of three, electric guitar, three trumpets, conga timpani, bass and choirs, apparently the group is called "Cubanacán". The orchestra includes Yo Yo González and Jos.

FACUNDO RIVERO Y SU RITMO

Santa Clara, 1912. Pianist, composer, conductor. He started out learning saxophone that he had to give up due to throat problems, and then he took up the piano. At the age of nine he was already playing at the La Caridad theater. He went to Havana, playing with the Belisario López orchestra for ten years. He created the set of voices Siboney, with Isolina

Carrillo, Joseíto Núñez, Marcelino Guerra and Alfredo León. He begins to compose, Negro mandinga soy, Ponte dura mulata that Miguelito Valdés records for him. In 1942 he wrote one of his best-known numbers, I am learning English. He organized his vocal quartet in 1949 with Cecilia González, Nelia Núñez, Abel de Rivero and Jesús Leyte. They traveled to Mexico in 1950, where Elba Montalvo already replaced Nelia. Cecilia is later replaced by Sirelda. Ultimately, the four separate from Facundo, with the name of Los Rivero: Elba, Sirelda, Abel and Ebano. Facundo threatens to take them to court for usurpation of name, but nothing can be done: Abelardo's last name is Rivero too ... But Facundo continues his career, composes a famous lullaby dedicated to his son, Lacho, and works in different countries. Since 1959 he has been domiciled in the United States, he continues to work in New York and Miami, until he retires in the latter city. He lives in Miami in a wheelchair since he suffered a stroke. His fellow Cuban artists pay him a well-deserved tribute on June 20, 1997. He passed away in 2002.

MARCO RIZO (cu)

Santiago de Cuba, Oriente province, 11/30/1920 - New York, 9/8/1998. Pianist and composer. His father, director of classical music, was his first teacher, beginning at the age of seven. At fifteen he moved to Havana, completing his studies with Professor César Pérez Sentenat and Harmony and Composition with Pedro San Juan, then Director of the Havana Symphony Orchestra. He entered the Havana Philharmonic as a pianist for three years. In 1949 he established his residence in the United States, debuting at the Town Hall in New York and later performing on CBS radio station. He spent two years in the Army and at the end of the war he settled in California and began to work with Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz on their

famous television show "I love Lucy", of which he was musical director, arranger and composer until its completion in 1960. He performed these same roles on various occasions for the Ed Sullivan, Perry Como and Bob Hope shows. Rizo expanded his studies by graduating from the Juilliard School of Music in New York and the University of Los Angeles in California, where he received his Master's Degree. On various occasions he has written music for Columbia, Metro and Paramount studios. In New York he was an arranger for the Columbia Broadcasting System. As a pianist he has performed, among other orchestras, with the Boston Pops, performing his own "Broadway Concert" which he premiered at Carnegie Hall in 1976. Rizo has performed with equal ease as a composer, conductor and pianist. In the first aspect, in addition to the well-known theme of the program I love Lucy and other songs in the popular genre, Rizo has written more serious works of Cuban music such as his José Martí Symphony, the Cuban Symphony, the Peasant Suite, the Ñáñigo Ballet, the Yamba o

Ballet, the Music of the Americas Suite and the Liturgy to Our Virgin of Charity, the latter premiered at the Lincoln Center. Rizo has made numerous recordings for the Victor, Capitol, Decca, Roulette, SMC, Somerset, Tico, Forum labels. Among other awards, Marco Rizo has received the Silver Medal from the French Academy of Arts, Sciences and Letters. As a performer, he performs the classical, jazz or Latin music repertoire with the same dexterity. This dynamic artist has devoted



much of his time to educational activities in recent years, helping to prepare young musicians, as Director of the Rainbow Orchestra and disseminating Cuban and Latin music in general, alone or with his Jazz Quartet. Latino that includes percussionist Cándido Camero. Through the non-profit "The Marco Rizo Latin American Music Project" (SAMPI) Foundation, Rizo offered his art and his lessons to children and young people throughout the United States to initiate them in music.

ARSENIO RODRÍGUEZ Y SU CONJUNTO

Matanzas, Cuba, 8/31/1913 - Los Angeles, California, 12/30/1970. Arsenio Rodríguez was born in Güira de Macurijes, a small town in the province of Matanzas, according to the data that he himself gave to the Registry when correcting his birth registration. At the age of seven he begins to lose his sight as a result of a horse kick. From a very poor family, of Congolese origin, he grew up in the nearby town of Güines where he learned to play the tres and the bass, the maracas, the tumbadora and the bongo. By the 30s he was already established in Havana as a tres player and began to compose from 1928. He played in several sextets, but his first opportunity was as a composer, when the Casino de la Playa recorded him in 1937 as the first of all his recordings the Afro Bruca Manigüá in the voice of Miguelito Valdés, followed by Ben acá Tomá, and in 1938 Yo son macuá, Fufuñando, Yo soy gangá and Se va el caramelero, where he also has a solo of three as a guest artist. Possibly from these contacts with La Casino de la Playa the idea arose in Arsenio of converting the typical septet as a whole, adding a second trumpet and piano to it. (See note at the end) Jaime Jaramillo took us away from the fact that they were the first recordings of compositions by Arsenio, since in 1935, the Machín Quartet had recorded in New York, four numbers of Arsenio, Perfumed flower, Victor 32596, I have not lied Aida, Victor 32604, Bitter sufferings, Vic-32729, and Victor 32721, Don't come back here, but apparently, like all of Machín's recordings, they were not known in Cuba ...

In 1940 he made his debut as Arsenio Rodríguez and his group, making his first two recordings, El pirulero no return más capitalizing on the success of Se va el caramelero- Y Yo tá namorá (which was recorded shortly after by Casino de la Playa) thus beginning the story. record label of one of the musical organizations with the greatest popular impact and historical importance that Cuba has had. Sergio Santana points out to me that they are the first that Arsenio does, but not the first that are made of his music, since the Machín Quartet had recorded five songs for him in 1935, Flor Perfumada (Perfumed flower), No he mentido (I have not lied), Aida, Amargos sufrimientos (Bitter sufferings) and No vuelvas por aqui (Don't come back here).

Arsenio brought it all together: as a composer, settled in the deep foundations of his conga culture, he mastered all aspects of their music, language, dances and traditions and thus introduced in his afros, sones, guaguancós and other rhythmic themes, the wonderful musical world Afro-Cuban; but at the same time he was a very sensitive, romantic spirit, capable of capturing beautiful boleros of an original style such as the famous *La vida es un sueño* (life is a dream). An extraordinary performer of tres, with his technique he managed to turn this instrument, which is difficult to finger when it comes to speed, into something capable of turning pianistic montunos into tresistic montunos. He had an ear out of the ordinary, as every director of a musical group needs but also a fine intuition for being original and offering something new



to the public. He understood that the sextet as a musical group, generally made up of black or mestizo musicians, was being displaced by the so-called jazz bands, composed mostly of white musicians. He also understood that an orchestra

composed only of black musicians would have strong opposition to break through and that an intermediate formula - less than an orchestra but greater than the sextet - adding first a second trumpet and the piano, and then a third trumpet and the tumbadora, it would be the most indicated. And since there was plenty of talent among black musicians, he was able to afford to choose the best musicians and singers for his group.

Soon the Arsenio Ensemble became popular on radio programs, in dances and in 1942 all the velloneras in Cuba played ad nauseam *Como traigo la yuca*, which the public renamed *Dile a Catalina*. This success was followed, also with frenzy, by the number of the inspiration of *Chappottín Oye* como dice based on a popular motif; In Cuba the game of the ball or charade was very popular, which although illegal, was more popular than the official game. He would bet from 1 to 36, which were the 36 numbers of Chino de la Charada, each number corresponded to an animal, person or object, and thus along with the alphabet the Cuban children learned that one was a horse, two was a butterfly, three was a sailor, four cat and so on. To guide (or disorient) the player, the banker (operator of the bolita business) gave a verse with the bet of each day, and at the same time wrote down that number, he kept it in an envelope that hung from the roof of his house, and it did not come down until night, generally at 8:00 pm, when the number was made public, to find out who had won. Every morning, the pointers (banker's agents) spread out around Havana, especially in the poor neighborhoods, visiting their clients and giving them the verse of the day, under the ritual phrase: "Oye como dice" ("Hey how is it said"). A typical verse could be: "Caballero que anda por los tejados, sin romper una teja" ("Gentleman who walks on the rooftops, without breaking a tile"). When the cautious players bet on the number 4 (the cat) the banker "threw" the number 9 (the elephant) and explained to his deceived clients: "The elephant does not break a tile, it breaks them all ..." and this stamp is Chappottín collects, dedicating a verse to each of the Cuban provinces.

From the work of David F. García, we have taken in a synthesized form, the composition of the groups that Arsenio used at various times. This is a very difficult job because of the way Arsenio's career developed, with two completely different stages in the second of which, developed in the United States, he had to change musicians continuously. We repeat that we have taken the most important information, but we do not include other possible musicians that have been suggested to Professor García at various stages of the orchestra or recordings and that he includes in his detailed and careful work, which should be consulted as soon as it is published. Nor have we included groups for which we have no recorded record. In the cases in which Professor García points out a soloist in a certain number, we have so stated in the respective recording where it corresponds. It should also be noted that, especially in his stage in Cuba, Arsenio used to use two first voices, and a second voice, to obtain the unique sound of his group. You will also notice that the name of Chappottín is always mentioned very closely with that of Arsenio, but nevertheless, the time that the famous trumpeter played with him was short (1949-52).

According to David F. García, the composition of the orchestra for the 1940 recordings was: Pedro Luis Sarracent y Miguelito Cuní, first voices; Marcelino Guerra, second voice and guitar; Rubén Calzado, 1st trp. and arranger; Miguel Molinet, 2nd trp.; Arsenio, three; "Papa Kila", bg.; Lino Frías, piano; Nilo Alfonso, low; Israel Rodríguez "Kike", tumb. For the following recordings of 1941 and those of June 1942, Conrado Cepero as 1st voice, alternating with Sarracent and Miguelito Cuní; René Hernández and then Adolfo O'reilly (Panacea) at the piano. For those of September 1943, the entry of Benetín Bustillo is indicated as 2nd trp.; and the entry of Orlando Sirial "Guichichi" as 2nd voice for Guerra in November 1943. For July 1945, Terry Mapi replaced Sarracent in the 1st trp. and Rubén González as pianist.

In November 1945, Joseíto Núñez entered as 1st voice, alternating with Cuní. And for May 1946, René Álvarez replaced Joseíto. Cuní left in June 1946 replaced by René Scull, and Guillermo Fellové or Domingo Corbacho replaced Benetín in the 2nd trp. Enter Juan Rogert as 3rd trp. and Luis Martínez Griñán, "Lili" at the piano. By December 1946, Alvarez left and was replaced by Sarracent as one of the first voices. At some point in that year or the next, Guichichi will be replaced as 2nd voice and guitar by Carlos Ramírez. And the trumpets stabilize in Mapi, Rogert and Corbacho. Lázaro Prieto replaces Nilo on bass.



Félix Alfonso, "Chocolate", replaces Kike in the tumb. During the year 1948 there are changes in the order of the trumpets, but they remain the same, except Guillermo Fellové who replaces Corbacho and it is not known for sure who the trumpeters were in the following year, 1949, except that in August Alfredo Armenteros entered as second trumpet and for September 1949 Chappottín enters as first trumpet, and as third Oscar Velasco, Florecita.

In 1949 Armenteros is replaced by Carmelo Alvarez who enters as 3rd trumpet. In 1951 he followed the trio of voices of Scull, Cepero and Ramírez, except in the cases in which Estela, Arsenio's sister, sings; Kike rejoins, and shares the tumbadora with Chocolate. At the end of 1951, Cuní returns, replacing Cepero.

For the recordings with Seeco in 1952, René Scull and Manolo Morales "El barroso" are the first voices and Cándido Antomattei, guitar and Second voice. Luis Berríos Serralta, Edil Rivera and Héctor Vidal "Venezuela", trps.; Ray Coen, p. and fix; Prieto on bass, Kike on tumbadora and Raúl Travieso on bongoses, and Arsenio on tres.

For the recordings with Tico in 1953, Morales is eliminated on vocals. For the Victor recordings in 1955 in New York, Luis Kortright "Wito" enters first voice and Morales returns. Enter Israel Berríos as guitarist. René "The whip" Hernández replaces Coen on piano and Evaristo Baró for Prieto on bass. For the recordings of the Victor in Cuba in 1956, the voices are Wito and Estela, first, Sirial; second, Cabrerita, p.; Enrique Pérez, dtor. and trp.; and the others are Raúl Díaz and Armando Dávila; Tomás Carrillo in the tres, Sabino Peñalver, bass; Papa Kila on the bg. and Chocolate on the tmb., and a new element: Elpidio on the timpani. The voices change for the 1956 Victor recordings with Ester Regla Travieso, Anastasio Vila and Sirial. Florecita is added as the 4th trumpet and Tata Güines replaces Chocolate in the tumb.

In New York for the album "Sabroso y Caliente" from 1957, Arsenio returns to his group with Wito and Julián Llanos as lead voices, Antomattei as Segunda; Pedro Luis Jackson, Luis Berríos and Mario Cora, trp.; Gilberto Valdés, flute; Israel Berríos, g.; "The whip", p.; Baró, low; Francisco Angel Bastar "Kako" on the timpani; Raúl Travieso in the bg.; and Kike in the tumbadora.

For "Palo congo", recorded in 1957, apparently the group is smaller with Sabú Martínez, tumb.; Arsenio, Raúl Travieso, Kike, Baró, Ray "Mosquito" Romero on the conga; and Willie Capó and Sara Baró, singers.

For "Primitivo", recorded in 1958, Ramón Quián "Monguito" and Davy González, first voices; Antomattei, second; Berríos, 2da y g.; Kike, tumb .; and Caraballoso on the trumpet in addition to Arsenio.

For the Ansonia recordings (1960), Raffi Martínez, Israel Castro, Antomattei and Chewi Rivera sang in 1337, and for 1418, Marcelino Guerra, Berríos and Cerón. Agustín Caraballoso, Chocolate Armenteros and Víctor Paz, trp.; Alfredito Valdés Jr., p. and "The whip" too; Evelio Quintero, timb.; Kike, tumb.; Arsenio and bass is not mentioned.

For the recordings "Cumbanchando con Arsenio", SMC-1074 (1962), there is a small group with Arsenio, who also sings, Kike en la tumb .; Jackson on bass; Sabú Martínez in the tumb .; Raúl Travieso in the bg .; Israel Berríos 2nd voice and g.; and Rosalía Montalvo, 1st voice.

For "Quindembo" (1963) they were Arsenio singing, playing tres y tumb .; Walter Gene Jefferson, tall; Mauricio Smith, tenor sax and arr .; Baró, low; Quintero, drums; Kike, tumb .; and José Valiente, perc.

For the recordings of Tico 1092 (1963) there were Arsenio, Jackson on bass; René Hernández, piano and arrangements, except in Porfiando el gallo where the pianist and arranger was Alfredito Valdés.

For "Viva Arsenio" (1966), he again sang and played the tres, with Marcelino Guerra as second voice; Cachao on the bass; Quintero, timb. and drums; José Mangual in the bg.; Berríos, 2nd voice and Kike, tumb.

For "Arsenio dice" (1968), Arsenio, Marcelino, Kike, Berríos, "El látigo" at the piano; Agustín Carabolloso in the trp.; and the following musicians without pointing instr. Juan I. Pérez, Pedro Andino, José L. Pérez, Clifford A. Joseph, Andrés A.T. Martínez, Ronald Jones, Julián Llanos, singing; and Bebo, sax.

As for singers and soloists in each number, we have only conformed the first four numbers of the Victor to the information of David García, but this must be taken into account to really know who sings in each number.

The following numbers were recorded by Columbia in Havana on 5/16/41. Apparently, they were not used. (Data provided by Richard Spottswood).

Pablo Rodríguez Lozada. Santurce, 4/1/1923- New York, 2/28/1973. Under the tutelage of his brother Johnny, he began to sing very young and made his debut at age 13 with the ensemble of maestro Ladislao Martínez on the WKAQ radio station and immediately made his first recording, the bolero Amor perdidos de Ladí. At the age of 16, already orphaned by both father and mother, he joined the Siboney group led by his brother Johnny and recorded in 1940. He also recorded with the Marcano and Mayarí quartets. In the forties he went to New York, always with the help of his brother and both joined the Madriguera orchestra, Tito as a bongo player in this case, but when Johnny left, he also recorded as a singer. The following year he recorded with Xavier Cugat. He goes through the orchestras of Noro Morales, Eddie Lebaron, Curbelo. In 1947 he recorded several numbers for the Coda label with an orchestra that was actually Machito's. IN 1948 he already had his own group, Los Diablos del Mambo. He studies singing, vibraphone and percussion. He changes the name of his group to Los Lobos del mambo and is already the star of the famous Palladium with his band, and the rivalry with the other Tito, Puente, begins. He is drifting from a danceable orchestra to a romantic singer, especially after his gigantic success with Unforgettable in 1963. His recordings for the UA Latino label are bolero classics. He resides in Puerto Rico, for 30 weeks he produces a magnificent television program, EL Show de Tito Rodríguez. In 1969 he founded his own label, TR, and the hits continued. He moves to Florida and in 1971 a leukemia is discovered from which he would die. Elegant, a perfectionist, he created his own style of saying the song and dressed it in the best possible orchestral finery. When a contract was presented to the Capitol, Andy agreed and recorded *Bésame mucho* in both languages, which sold more than a million copies. He also worked as a drummer in Stan Kenton's orchestra, Alvino Rey's, etc., but after the success of *Bésame mucho*, he continued alone as a singer. Almost without realizing it, he was one of the first, or perhaps the first artist to do the crossover. In 1950 he moved to Mexico and stayed there for twenty years, with frequent trips to the rest of the continent and to Spain. In 1959 he was performing in Havana when the Cuban Revolution triumphed.
